- I **chose** to not follow the rules. Could you please **choose** a color? (chose & choose)
- I would like a cookie for **dessert**. I went on a hike in the **desert**. (dessert & desert)
- I **know** that I got that wrong. Are we going **now** or later? (know & now)
- This **does** not make sense. (does)
- My mom **went** to the store today. **When** did she go to the store? (when & went)
- I didn't do my homework **because** I fell asleep. (because)
- My mom slammed on her **brakes** to miss the other car. I need to take a **break**. (break & brake)
- I have **a lot** of friends. (a lot)
- It is okay to **lose** sometimes. My pants are **loose**. (lose & loose)
- In the **past** many people have done a great job. I **passed** in my paper to the teacher. (past & passed)

- I went to the mall and **then** the movie theater. I would rather go play **than** take a bath. (then & than)
- Make a left **to** get **to** school. I love to ski **too!** I have **two** pairs of shoes. (to, two & too)
- **Where** are we going to meet? Are you going to **wear** your tennis shoes? (wear & where)
- Will you **write** down your answers? You got the **right** answer. (write & right)
- Will you **do** me a favor? Your paper is **due** tomorrow. The **dew** on the grass made my shoes wet. (do, due & dew)
- Will you **meet** me at the mall? I **met** my brother for a basketball game. (meet & met)
